Faith Conquers Through Courage Tested: A Combat Veteran's Story Paperback – December 5, 2024 by Milton A. Toratti (Author)

The 'real story' is not about war, but about the indomitable spirit of man. It is about how men, American fighting men, trapped in the most hellish of circumstances endured. It is about how, left only with their faith in God, their country and their fellow pilots, they managed to keep fighting in every way they could without physical weapons. It is about how they survived and 'returned with honor'. This story is not about me. It is about Bud Day and Bob Craner and P.K. Robinson, John McCain, Misty pilot POWs, and more than 500 other POWs, and an extraordinary man named Lance Sijan, and about faith in God and how it sustains us all. The torturers and the treatment in the remote areas was brutal in every way. The eyewitnesses by Mistys, the unit I was in, had as one of its responsibilities flying overhead and coordinating the rescue of pilots shot down. In just the previous months before I started flying with them, the Mistys had seen two pilots surrounded by North Vietnamese civilians and troops on the ground hacked to death with machetes as the Mistys were circling trying to rescue them. 

Chaplain's Corner-Intelligent Design


There has been much discussion about Intelligent Design vs. Evolution. Have you ever studied the complexity of God's creation? I recently had a detached retina. As I looked at the model of an eye in the doctor's office I marveled about how incredibly complex the eye actually is, and I did not even think about the connections to the brain that enables us to see things.

Evidence of God's creation is all around us and we most often don't even think about it. We just get used to things we see every day and forget how complex things around us are. I saw a headline the other day that said researchers discovered that the human brain is actually many times more powerful than previously assumed. Supercomputers have been compared to the human brain and they are nowhere as powerful.

In molecular biology, the term double helix refers to the structure formed by double-stranded molecules of nucleic acids such as DNA. If you study the double helix of DNA you have to come to the conclusion that this incredibly complex mechanism did not just happen. Even single cell mechanisms require a number of amino acids to allow then to function.

If we use the evolution argument for creation of beings the odds say it would take many thousands of mutations just to create one amino acid that a one cell organism requires. While we would wait for many more thousands of mutations to occur to create the second amino acid required by the organism the first amino acid would not survive because it takes all of the amino acids, in many case dozens of them, for the organism to survive. Multiply that times the billions of cells required for our body to function and you cannot comprehend the complexity.

A single strand of DNA has all of the items needed to create all of the different cells, organs, etc. required for a fully formed human. The same goes for animals. Genesis 1:1 tells us, "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was without form, and void". Genesis 1:27 tells us, "So God cre-



ated man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them." Psalm 148: says, "Let them praise the name of the LORD, For He commanded and they were created".



There are also many things in the world that if slightly changed would not allow life on earth to continue, things like the tilt of the earth's axis, the distance from the sun, the atmosphere that provides the rain and protects us from the sun and many others. Life would not be sustainable with minor changes of many things.

The conclusion is that the earth and its beautiful flowers, mountains, seas, fish and animals could not just happen; they were created by a loving God, who wants to fellowship with you. Isaiah 40:26 says, "Lift up your eyes on high, and see who has created these

things." Lift up your eyes and talk to the God that created us.
